This workshop is for players of **Loud Winds - shawms, sackbutts, cornetts, curtals** - together with crumhorns and recorders, providing players with the opportunity to enjoy the rich and varied sonority of a Renaissance Big Band. The repertoire will be drawn from across Europe, including German chorales, Italian carnival music, French dances, Flemish polyphony, & music from the English Tudor court. The cost is £16. Pitch will be A=440. Players should bring a music stand.

Tim has studied, performed and tutored Renaissance wind and brass for thirty years, championing this repertoire with his colleagues in the York Waits. He frequently gives early music demonstrations and leads performance workshops, and is experienced at combining different instruments and levels of experience into a cohesive ensemble.

Kelmscott Manor, www.kelmscottmanor.co.uk, once the country home of William Morris, now in the care of the Royal Society of Antiquaries, is two miles from Lechlade, which is readily accessible from the M4 at Swindon, or A40 at Burford.
