## Heinrich Schütz the German Orpheus



## An Illustrated talk by **Andrew Griffiths**

In this illustrated Zoom lecture, designed to complement his live workshop on 29th May, Andrew Griffiths paints a vivid picture of the life and work of a real musician's musician: Heinrich Schütz, who died 350 years ago in 1672. His long life - he lived to 87 - encompassed both huge political and societal upheaval (notably the Thirty Years' War) and momentous changes in musical style; he himself studied with Giovanni Gabrieli and was acquainted with Monteverdi, who we are told 'guided him with joy'. A prolific composer and publisher of predominantly sacred music, his music responds with the utmost sensitivity to text, whether in his resplendent polychoral psalms and sacred concertos or in the exquisite refinement of his later motets, histories and passions.

Andrew Griffiths has a varied career as a conductor, consort singer (Stile Antico) and continuo player, alongside his work as Head Coach at the National Opera Studio. His recent projects have included conducting the UK premiere of Lidarti's Ester, an eighteenth-century Hebrew language oratorio, continuo for Theodora and Ariodante at The Royal Opera, and a Venetian Christmas Vespers in Bampton. Forthcoming engagements include directing a Passiontide programme with the BBC Singers and Monteverdi's 1610 Vespers at Dartington.
