Reading between the lines: how contemporary written descriptions can help transform early musical notation into sound

An illustrated talk on Zoom by John Bryan



For most pieces of Renaissance music, all we have to inspire our performances today is the musical notation, usually in separate parts rather than a score. While this information may have offered early modern composers and performers a relatively clear starting point, it is sometimes surprising to read contemporary written descriptions of music making that go well beyond the expectations arising from the surviving notation.

In this talk, we will investigate four pieces from sixteenth century Italy and England for which we have some contemporary form of verbal description, and can begin to discover how those original parts were interpreted by at least some Renaissance performers.

John Bryan is Emeritus Professor of Music at the University of Huddersfield and Artistic Adviser to the York Early Music Festival, and he's well known to many of us as a viol player and member of the Rose Consort of Viols. We're delighted to welcome him to give us this online talk on a fascinating subject.
