John Dunstaple – context and *contenance*

An Illustrated talk by Rory McCleery



In this illustrated Zoom lecture, designed to complement his live workshop in Northwood on 26th November, Rory McCleery explores the life, reputation and influence of John Dunstaple, arguably England's most important composer of the early fifteenth century. Details of Dunstaple's life are shrouded in mystery, and his position as chief exponent of the *contenance angloise* ascribed to him by Martin le Franc and Johannes Tinctoris and confirmed by later music theorists may not be entirely accurate, but what is undeniable is the beauty and ingenuity of his music, which would influence a generation of composers both in England and on the Continent.

Rory McCleery is the founder and artistic director of award-winning vocal ensemble The Marian Consort, with whom he performs, broadcasts and records across the UK, Europe, North America and Asia. He and they were recently featured on the flagship BBC 2 series Art That Made Us, performing and discussing Dunstaple's Veni sancte spiritus.

In addition to this and his work as a countertenor soloist and consort singer, Rory is much in demand as a guest conductor and workshop leader, and has led workshop sessions, study days and singing courses across the UK, Germany, Spain and the USA. He is a passionate believer in the importance of music education and singing for young people and is Artistic Co-Director of Dunster Festival in West Somerset.
